The Upper Extremity Center of Midwest Orthopaedics at Rush (MOR) is one of the only centers dedicated to the evaluation and treatment of the hand, wrist, elbow, and shoulder. The MOR surgeons specialize in the latest non-operative and surgical techniques for trauma (fractures), tendon and nerve conditions, and arthritis of the entire upper extremity. The Center combines surgery, rehabilitation, physical and occupational therapy, and research to provide the most advanced treatment for its patients.

The MOR upper extremity surgeons were among the first in the country to perform entirely arthroscopic repairs of hands, wrists, elbows, and shoulders including rotator cuff and instability repairs. They have helped design and develop some of the latest technologies for minimally invasive surgery of the upper extremities. This includes less invasive means of repairing fractures that allow for earlier functional recovery as well as the latest arthroscopic techniques for the hand, wrist, elbow, and shoulder. The Center is also one of the few to specialize in reconstruction, rehabilitation, and joint replacement for all joints from the shoulder to the fingers.

MOR is a highly subspecialized orthopaedic group practice of over 30 physicians, primarily based at Rush Univer-

sity Medical Center, Central DuPage Hospital, and Rush Oak Park Hospital. Each physician focuses on one of the following specialties:

- Foot and ankle
- Joint reconstruction
- Orthopaedic oncology
- Physical medicine/pain management
- Spine, back, and neck
- Sports medicine/athletic injuries
- Trauma
- Upper extremity: shoulder, elbow, wrist, and hand

The physicians of MOR are board certified and fellowship-trained in their subspecialty; hold academic appointments at Rush Medical College; are on staff at Rush University Medical Center; and are active in patient education and research.
